Of The Service Of God:

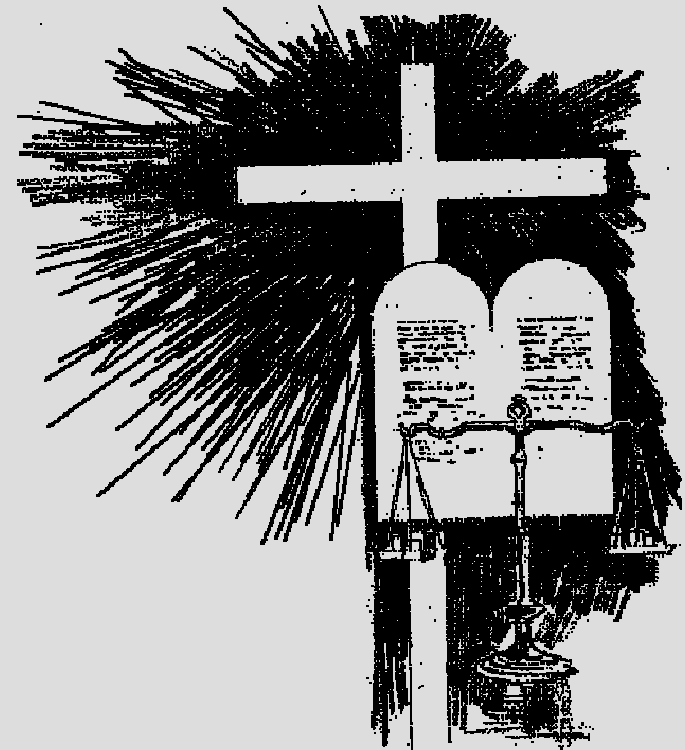
